Pursuant to written notice, the regular meeting of the City of Northfield Council was held on Monday, April 27, 2015, at the Fenley Office Park, 4965 U.S. Highway 42. TREASURER'S REPORT

The City holds several of these investments in its diversified portfolio.

POLICE REPORT

Police Chief Richard Frank briefed council members on recent activities throughout the city and stated that there were 14 car break-ins during the past month and 13 citations issued. Mayor Chappell asked that residents be reminded to remove valuables from their vehicles and report any suspicious activity to the police. He also reported that, while the NPD is doing everything possible to curb this vandalism, the Louisville Metro Police Department is now assisting them by increasing their patrol in our area.
